



## Mr. Charles Earl Green Sr.

April 23, 1940 - September 16, 2023

Charles Earl Green, Sr., age 83, passed away peacefully on September 16th, 2023, at The Hamptons at Meadows Place in Meadows Place, Texas.

He was born on April 23, 1940, in Independence, Texas to the late Edna E. Green and Clarence Ray White, Jr.

Charles spent an idyllic “country” life of fishing, hunting and riding horses in Independence. His maternal grandmother, Minnie R. Waters Green, was a major influence in his life and she ensured that he learned the value of a faith centered and prayerful life. Charles confessed his hope and trust in Christ at an early age and became united with Porter’s Chapel A.M.E. Church in Independence, Texas.

He was educated in Brenham Public Schools through the 7th grade. The family moved to Dickinson, Texas, in 1951, where he started the 8th grade at Paul Laurence Dunbar School. He was active in several extracurricular activities. Most notably, he developed a love for music and played saxophone in the band. He excelled academically and graduated in 1958.

After graduation, Charles attended Prairie View A&M University. He was active in campus life, ROTC and continued his musical pursuits as a member of the PV Marching Storm band. He graduated in 1962 with a Bachelor of

Science in Industrial Education. He then moved to Dallas and began his career as an educator for Dallas Independent School District. His first teaching assignment was at James Madison High School, followed by Justin F. Kimball High School and finally Thomas Jefferson High School. While teaching, he continued his graduate studies at North Texas State University, in Denton, Texas, and earned his Master of Education in 1966. He completed his scholarly pursuits receiving a second Masters of Education from East Texas State University in Commerce, Texas. Charles strongly believed knowledge brought an opportunity to make a difference and he passionately inspired and influenced students. After 42 years of teaching, he retired from DISD in 2004.

Charles met and married Evelyn P. Wheatley and they were faithful and devoted members of Rice Chapel AME Church in Dallas, Texas. He was a member of the male chorus and served in the laymen's organization.

For a brief time, he became a stylist for Master Bowie's barber shop. He was also a swim coach and loved making furniture. He joined the graduate chapter of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity Incorporated/Dallas, Texas and was an active member of the Dallas PV Alumni Chapter.

He is preceded in death by his wife, Evelyn P. Wheatley Green, parents, Edna E. Green Hawkins and Clarence Ray White, Jr.; stepfather, Robert Ozene Hawkins, stepmother Martha Morgan White; half-sisters Doris Preston and Hardense Mae White Dearborne and mother-in-law Evelyn Wheatley.
