I don't know if you remember Lestley or not (from when we were kids), but he told me that he always liked you. He said that you were very kind to him, and I can see that. You were very laid back.

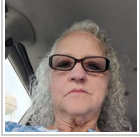

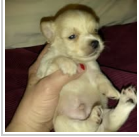
