



Mr. Johnny Adolph Goode, Jr.

June 16, 1938 - March 18, 2025

Johnny A. Goode was called to heaven on March 18, 2025. He was born in Anahauc, Texas on June 16, 1938 to Johnie A. Goode, Sr and Mattie Briggs Goode. He was the sixth child born in a family of ten children and was the second oldest boy. He was preceded in death by his mother, father and siblings; Mavis Goode, Billy Ray Goode, Lois Goode Crouch, Joyce Goode Shiro, Patsy Goode Damolin, Robert Goode and Michael Dale Goode. Johnny moved to Alvin as a young child and attended the Alvin School System. He had many jobs in his youth, including running the movies at the Alvin Drive In. However, construction seem to be his gift. At twenty-four he owned one third of Midas Homes, one of the first Construction Companies in Alvin to build subdivisions. He drew the house prints, poured the roads and foundations, helped with the framing and completion of the homes, in addition to being the general contractor.

This man could do anything involved with construction. After Midas homes was sold, he built several sewer treatment plants in East Texas. When he returned to Alvin in 1967, he designed and built mobile home parks, homes and remodeled homes. Then in 1969 he went to work on the new American National Insurance Building in Galveston, Texas. After a short time on the job Johnny's skills were noticed and he was selected to be the Chief Superintendent for the building. Under his leadership the project went from behind schedule to delivered on time.

After the American National Building was completed Johnny started Goode

Construction Company. He built multiple homes and commercial buildings, including Joe's Banquet Center. Johnny built so many buildings and homes around Alvin, he often said that he thought he had built half of Alvin.

Johnny was blessed not only with building skills, he also raced cars and won many trophies. He could out fish almost anyone in both fresh and salt water. He was one of the best cooks around and was famous for his fried fish, barbecue brisket and barbecue beans. He loved to feed, entertain his friends with his endless jokes and make people laugh. He had a great love for music and a wonderful singing voice. While he worked he would always sing. He would often introduce himself as Johnny B. Goode, the character in Chuck Berry's song.

Johnny is survived by his wife of 54 years Ann Troha Goode, his son; William Gregory Goode and his daughter; Lauri Goode Hopf ,four grandchildren , two great grandchildren and two siblings. He was truly blessed and loved people in addition to having a very soft heart for his animals. Johnny B. Goode was a "Man's Man" and can never be replaced. He will truly be missed.
