Nemiah McGowan, III was born on June 22, 1974 to Nemiah Jr. and Linda McGowan.

He was lovingly called Scooter by his family and close friends. He grew up in Texas City, Texas and was educated through the Texas City Independent School District. He was a 1992 graduate of Texas City High School. While in high school he had the distinct honor of Being Who's Who Among American High School Students in 1991 and in 1992. After high school he enlisted in the United States Army giving valiant service. Because of his outstanding service he received the following medals and ribbons: Iraq Campaign Medal with three Campaign Stars, Army Commendation Medal, Army Achievement Medal, Valorous Unit Award, Army Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Armed Forces Service Medal (AFSM), Non Commissioned Officer Professional Development Ribbon, Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon, NATO Medal, Combat Action Badge, Driver and Mech Badge, Driver and Mechanic Badge with Driver-wheeled Vehicles. His tour of duties included: Germany where he was deployed to Bosnia 10/1996-04/97, Kosovo 11/2000-05/2001, Iraq 04/2003-04/2004, Iraq 03/2005-02/2006, Iraq 11/2007-01/2009. He retired in July 2012 after 20 years of dutiful service.

Nemiah graduated from ITT Technical Institute in 2014 with an Associates of

Applied Science in Electrical Engineering with Honors, and in 2016 he received his Bachelor of Science in Electrical Engineering and Communications Technology with Honors. He loved fishing and reading, he was a die hard Dallas Cowboys fan and Texas Longhorn fan.

Nemiah grew up in Mt. Zion Baptist Church of Texas City, Texas where he was baptized. He and his family were very active in the church. He loved his family and spending quality time with them. He was a friend to many, and his kind persona will be missed by all who knew him.

He departed this life on March 12, 2018. He is survived by parents Nemiah Jr and Linda McGowan; sister, Yolanda; brother, Lloyd; nieces, DeJanelle and Jasmyn Routt; close friends that are like family: Rolando, Amanda, and Aryhiah Estabillo and Gary and Lacie Wright and a host of close knit aunts, uncles, cousins, and friends.

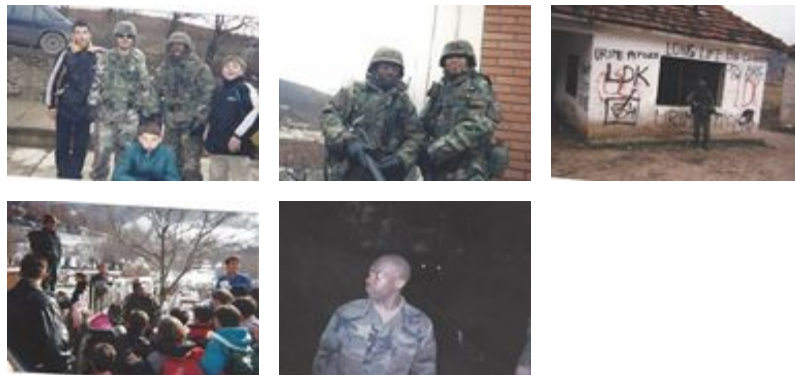

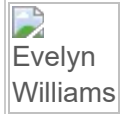
