Troy and I played sports together throughout our childhood and teenage years. My parents coached when we played Senior League ball for the George Miller team. During a game, Troy and I bumped into each other during a routine in-field pop up and missed the ball. My dad yelled at us saying that we looked like a couple of circus clowns out there. In typical Troy-fashion, when the inning ended and we returned to the dugout, Troy spouted off to my father. My dad immediately kicked him out of the dugout. I came to Troy's defense and I was thrown out too. Sometimes after high school baseball games, we would stop at buffet restaurants. Troy would get himself so worked up before, during, and after games, that he would overindulge and get himself sick. He would then go to the restroom, throw up, then come right back to eat more.

Speaking of food, Troy was a big eater. He would often order two full meals when we would stop to eat after a night out. In high school during off-campus lunches, Troy would always order more food than he had money for; then, he would have to change his order. He did this over and over and never learned.

When we were freshman in high school, Troy and I had some pretty fun times while double-dating the Alamo Heights girls, even though those relationships were short-lived.

As a teenager, Troy always said he would attend UT and be a "t-sip"; but instead, he ended up graduating from A&M, like me. We both ended up Aggies.

I hope these fond memories of mine give you a glimpse of the Troy I know and love.

“ This week has been difficult as I think of the lifetime of memories I have with Troy. Thinking of the great times I had with Troy is part of my healing process. I would like to share some of those memories with others who loved him too.

Although I do not recall the details of how we first met when we were around 10 or 11 years old, Troy vividly remembered that day and would bring it up often. He said I asked him to join me in a fist fight I was about to have with a group of boys; he said “okay” and took off with me. We were best friends from that day on.

These are some of the things I will never forget about Troy – Troy was always there for me during my most difficult times. He was always a good listener. Whenever we called each other, he would start every conversation with “Dur, Dur, Dur” (kind of an inside joke we had).

Growing up together, we did a lot of stupid crap; but we had some great times. We could get really pissed off at each other, but we would always reconcile within days.

I have several memories with Troy at both Rockport and Port Aransas beaches – like throwing cabbage-head jellyfish at each other and cruising up and down the strip blasting our favorite tunes. I spent a lot of time at his grandparents’ house. Otto and Betty are very dear to my heart. I remember stuffing our faces with home cooked meals prepared for us by them. The chocolate chip pancakes and soft-shell crabs were the best! We would get into Otto’s and Betty’s homemade mustang grape wine and yucky fig liqueur; or we would drink Otto’s quality Falstaff & Heidelberg beer. We had some great parties at Otto’s and Betty’s garage apartment. As kids, we would “role play” skits and sing jingles from Saturday Night Live together. Coming home from school, we would often race each other home on FM 1781 taking up both lanes – me in my old Chevy Impala and Troy in his brand new, shiny Toyota Celica. We also used to ride Troy’s mini-bike two-up Dumb & Dumber-style to and from our houses on the dark, winding roads.

I recall us going to the Monsters of Rock concert at the Cotton Bowl in 1988, as well as numerous concerts over the years. Attending a punk/metal concert at the Galvan Ballroom in Corpus Christi, Troy

took his first stage dive, but made the mistake of jumping into a group of girls instead of guys. The girls spread out and Troy ended up hitting the floor with a thud. Luckily, he wasn't injured.

Troy had this fake Washington state Driver's License under the name Bruce Lee that he would use to buy beer at the infamous Fulton "green store" for our occasional liquid lunches. Troy was always a sneaky little shit. During parties, Troy was known to hide beer in the fridge and would tell everyone we were out, all the while secretly enjoying cold ones himself. There was even a party once where Troy took empty beer bottles and filled them with his own "special brew" and offered them up to a foreign exchange student we had just met that night.

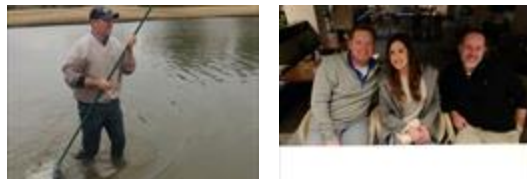

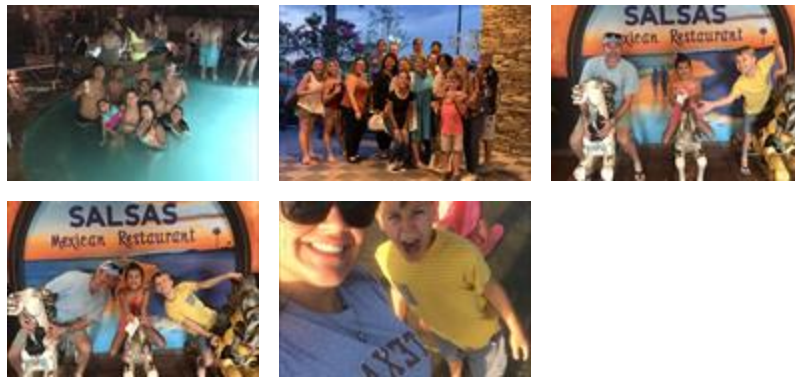

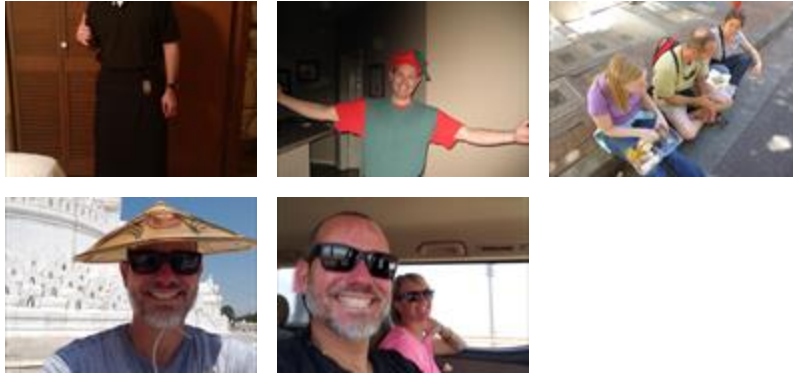
